

# Vaccination and Surgery Schedule

## PUPPY HEALTH PLAN

Start a vaccination schedule beginning at 6 weeks of age and continue giving boosters every 3 weeks until the puppy has reached 4 ½ to 5 months old.

### AGE

*6 Weeks* Physical Exam  
First Office Visit Distemper/Parvo with Corona (DHPPC)  
Fecal  
Dewormer (Depending On Weigh of Puppy and Type of Parasites)  
Heartworm Preventative

*9 Weeks* Physical Exam  
Distemper/Parvo with Corona (DHPPC)  
Fecal (If Previous Test was Positive)  
Devormer (Depending On Weight of Puppy and Type of Parasites)  
Heartworm Preventative

*12 Weeks* Physical Exam  
Distemper/Parvo (DHLPP)  
Rabies  
County Tag  
Fecal (If Previous Test was Positive)  
Heartworm Preventative

*15 Weeks* Physical Exam  
Distemper/Pravo (DHLPP)  
Heatworm Preventative

*18 Weeks* Physical Exam  
Parvo Booser

SPAY: We recommend that a female puppy be spayed around 6 months of age. This occurs after the vaccination schedule has been completed so that the puppies are well protected from diseases. Additionally, we like to spay dogs before they come into their first heat cycle which usually occurs around 9 months of age, however can be different depending upon the breed. Please consult your veterinarian to determine whether this is the normal heat cycle for your breed of dog. By spaying the puppy early in this manner is less expensive and will help reduce the chance of the puppy ever developing mammary cancer.

Neuter: We recommend that a male puppy be neutered around 6 months of age which is after the vaccination schedule has been completed. By waiting until after the vaccination schedule has been completed it provides the puppy with ample protection against diseases. Additionally, by neutering the male early helps to diminish the possibility of developing hormonal-related behavior problems.
